## **Selection criteria for the call for applications concerning international incentive funding for first and second-cycle education**

Every semester, the Faculty of Medicine announces funding to promote internationalisation in first and second-cycle education. These funds enable activities such as travel to develop partnerships, teaching staff mobility and the development of international projects and courses.

### **Selection is based on the following criteria:**

- **Strategic importance:** Link to the action plan for the internationalisation of first and second-cycle education at the Faculty of Medicine. You could mention Lund University's Global Dynamic Engagement (GDE) Policy in the application. Is there potential for multi-level collaboration? For example, could the partner university also be interesting for research?
- **Feasibility:** Assessment of the applicant's expertise in relation to the purpose of the application. Results of previous applications are taken into account.
- **Sustainability:** The long-term nature and significance of the project over time is of particular importance.
- **Transferability:** Relevance to other learning activities. How will the faculty benefit from the activity being carried out?

- Risk assessment: Based on the faculty's Global Responsible Engagement (GRE) checklist.

Regarding applications for funding for the development of international projects and courses, the following criteria will also be taken into account:

- Interprofessionalism
- Student influence
- Expected impact of the activity

### Further information

Applicants who have previously been granted this type of funding are to carry out the activity and submit a report before applying for more funding.

The faculty encourages wider international engagement within the faculty. If fulfilment of other criteria is assessed to be equal, applicants who have not previously been awarded funding may be given preference over returning applicants.

The criteria are assessed on a scale of 0-3 points.

The decision to award funding is to be made by the chair of the Undergraduate Education Board after preparation by the International Council, Faculty of Medicine.
