- 1. Document and reflect shortly on each seminar, by making a portfolio entry during, or close in time to, the seminar.
- 2. When it is time for assessment (half-time or defence), make a table similar to the one below, in which you list which seminars you'd like to refer to in relation to the seminar requirement. (it does not have to be calendar years)
